

#### TEACH Grants

Towards math, science, or foreign language certifications or those pursuing the TSD or bilingual endorsements. Must commit to working 4 years in a school district of need or must re-pay as a loan. Conditions apply.

#### ■ **NOYCE Grant** *Dr. Djanna Hill <u>HillD@wpunj.edu</u>*

Pursuing math or science licenses. National Science Foundation funding. Conditions apply.

#### **■ Teacher Loan Forgiveness:**

You must teach full-time for five complete and consecutive academic years in certain schools and educational service agencies that serve low-income families, and meet other qualifications, to be eligible for forgiveness of up to a combined total of \$17,500 on your <u>Direct Subsidized and Unsubsidized Loans and your</u> Subsidized and Unsubsidized Federal Stafford Loans

Minimum gpa, appropriate major, and other factors may be required for eligibility
